FORTUNE DRAGON




Located in Yong Peng, Johor, the Fortune Dragon is a 115-meter-long dragon tunnel reputed to be the world's longest of its kind. Visitors can enter through the dragon's mouth and walk through its air-conditioned interior, which features 42 Chinese paintings depicting Buddhist teachings and the afterlife. According to ancient Taoist folklore, those who complete the journey from the dragon's mouth to its tail will enjoy good fortune and ward off evil


FOODIE TRAIL


TAMAN SRI JAYA


KARI KAMBING 40 HARI
